Samuel: Persevering through challenges

Samuel had always dreamed of studying at university. In 2018, he applied for Yspaniola's scholarship program, encouraged by former scholar and staff member, Julio Louis. With many qualified applicants, he was not awarded a scholarship that year. Determined to pursue his dream, he persevered with help from family and friends, finding just enough funds to enroll at the Technological University of Santiago in Tourism Business Administration.

Sadly, a few months into his program, Samuel's mother became ill. Samuel needed to accompany her daily to the hospital for radiation therapy. His family needed to dedicate all their funds and time to support his mother's medical treatment. Samuel was forced to drop out of his studies to care for his mother.

Fortunately, in 2019 another opportunity to apply for an Yspaniola scholarship arose. Undeterred from his dream, he applied once again. On the day of his mother's final radiation therapy session, Samuel learned that he had been awarded a scholarship. Samuel and his mother both cried with joy, knowing that he would continue his dream.

Samuel hopes to graduate in March 2025. He says, "The community is in my heart. I want to offer nutritious cooking workshops to the community, and in this way support children, young adults and Yspaniola. Receiving this scholarship has been fundamental, the basis of everything. It has allowed me to fulfill my dream and become a professional."

Our Programs and Team Grow

This school year has been very special for several reasons. **First**, student enrollment has grown significantly, both in our preschool, in the learning center, and in the programs we carry out at the public school. Last year we served 66 students and now we serve 102 students!

Second, in April of 2023, Yspaniola received the first place Montessori prize from the DREAM Project, an NGO based in Cabarete, Dominican Republic. Our team was thrilled to have this opportunity to transform our preschool into a Montessori classroom. In August 2023, Yspaniola's teachers traveled to Cabarete to complete their training in the Montessori method with DREAM, and furniture and facility improvements were made to prepare the preschool.

And the **third** reason? Our Yspaniola team has grown! New staff include María Esther Hernandez (preschool teacher), Mariela Corsino (preschool assistant) and Willy Multidor (learning center assistant). They have each shown great dedication to Yspaniola, giving their best each day to ensure that the children of Batey Libertad learn to read and write in a safe, nurturing environment.

Last but not least, Mayra Rodriguez, former Yspaniola scholar and long-time teacher in the learning center, now has a new role as Academic Coordinator for Yspaniola. She is now supporting and coordinating the work of Yspaniola's teachers with great skill and dedication.



Food Program

Yspaniola's food program continues to benefit all our students, ensuring that they have the energy and sustenance they need to focus and learn optimally in class.

The results were very encouraging, with significant improvement in reading level after an introductory period of forty 45 minute class sessions. On average, the 45 students in the program were on track to have 1.5 years of reading growth in the academic year.






Keilin reading "Después de la escuela", book from the Reading AZ system.

Yspaniola Arrives to Los Mina Sur

In December 2022, Yspaniola began a pilot project at the Juan Bautista Zafra school located in Los Mina Sur in Santo Domingo, in which two initiatives were developed: the first was a literacy program, aimed at elementary age students who had difficulties in reading and writing. The second initiative consisted of a leadership program for middle school students.

Partnering with the school's director and teachers, we evaluated 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students who were most struggling in reading and writing. As in Batey Libertad, we used the Reading A-Z assessment system, identifying a student's reading level.



All Girls at School, Every Day of the Month

This powerful motto defines the mission of the Spanish NGO CromosomosX, an organization that we partnered with this year to start an educational program to dismantle taboos and shame around menstruation.

Phase one of the project aimed to improve the menstrual health and well-being of girls and women residing in Batey Libertad. Two local facilitators, Chiclina and Idelove, delivered a comprehensive course of interactive workshops with 57 adolescents aged 11 to 15. They also held community sessions with local parents and guardians, as well as with educators at the Batey Libertad public school.

In the second phase, completed this fall, the program was brought to Jaibón, Laguna Salada, a community near Batey Libertad, where 140

students participated from the Eugenio María de Hostos high school, with 10 facilitators trained by the program.

In April of 2024 we will administer surveys to assess the effectiveness of the program. We aim to decrease menstruation-related school absences and increase the use of sustainable menstrual products. We hope that adolescent girls participating in our program will experience their menstruation and sexuality without stigma, in a dignified and safe manner.

First Aid and Self-care for Everyone

It has been exciting to welcome visitors to Batey Libertad again after the pandemic! In February 2023, we hosted our first post-pandemic trip, with a group of ten health professionals from Brookside Community Health Center in Boston.

The group spent one week in the country, traveling and learning about the country's health care services and spending valuable time in Batey Libertad, learning from local residents, staying in home stays, and sharing their skills and professional knowledge.

They gave several workshops, including how to administer first aid and CPR and how to practice self-care and wellness techniques within healing circles. The workshops were well received, with many attendees. Participants of all ages learned side by side, with simulated scenarios in the former and music and aromatherapy in the latter.

The group visited neighborhoods in Santiago filled with colorful murals, learning about the behind-the-scenes action that goes into making Carnival in Santiago a reality. The group also traveled to Dajabón, where they were able to see the border between Haiti and the Dominican Republic and explore the binational market.

They stayed with families in Batey Libertad, building friendships and learning from local staff Sofía, Chiclina, Oriana, and Yohanna, who presented and facilitated discussions on immigration, politics, education, and more.



In June 2023, we hosted two groups for day visits to Batey Libertad, to learn about the challenges of documentation and migration between Haiti and the Dominican Republic.

The groups visited from Therapy Abroad and the Liceo Científico Dr. Miguel Canela Lázaro. During these visits, participants visited homes in Batey Libertad, learned about the difficulties of residents trying to obtain personal identity documents, shared lunch and stories with local families, and learned about the programs and advocacy carried out by Yspaniola.
